Clarkson College accepts transfer credit from Southeast Community College. The articulation agreement shows how courses completed at Southeast Community College will be transferred to Clarkson College. It is important for students transferring credit to Clarkson College to submit a final official transcript after completing all course work from other institutions. Students must receive a grade of "C-" or higher to be considered for transfer credit. Clarkson College does not accept transfer credit for courses taken after enrollment at Clarkson College.

All courses are also offered at Clarkson College and are not necessary for admission.

Elective Credit

Associate's degree: An additional 19 semester (28.5 quarter) hours may be transferred in as elective credit to Clarkson College.

Bachelor's degree: An additional 24 semester (36 quarter) hours may be transferred in as elective credit to Clarkson College.

Residency Requirement

Associate's degree: At least 40 semester hours must be completed at Clarkson College for an associate's degree.

Bachelor's degree: At least 27 semester hours must be completed at Clarkson College for a bachelor's degree.
