Clarkson College accepts transfer credit from University of Nebraska at Kearney. Students must receive a grade of "C-" or higher to be considered for transfer credit. Clarkson College does not accept transfer credit for courses taken after enrollment at Clarkson College.

Traditional Option (6 semesters): All courses may be taken at Clarkson College or equivalent from an accredited institution and are not necessary for application.

Transfer Option (4 semesters): Must have the following courses from an accredited institution with a transfer grade of a "C-" or higher completed.
