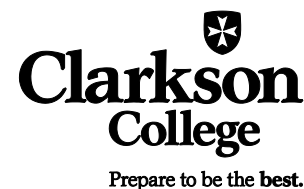

Clarkson College accepts transfer credit from University of Nebraska at Lincoln. The transfer guide shows how courses completed at University of Nebraska at Lincoln will be transferred to Clarkson College. It is important for students transferring credit to Clarkson College to submit a final official transcript after completing all course work from other institutions. Students must receive a grade of “C-” or higher to be considered for transfer credit. Clarkson College does not accept transfer credit for courses taken after enrollment at Clarkson College.

Elective Credit

Traditional BSN program: An additional eight credit hours may be transferred in as elective credit to Clarkson College.

RN to BSN program: An additional eleven credit hours may be transferred in as elective credit to Clarkson College.

LPN to BSN program: An additional seven credit hours may be transferred in as elective credit to Clarkson College.

Residency Requirement At least 27 semester hours must be completed at Clarkson College for a bachelor’s degree.
