Clarkson College has a signed articulation agreement with Central Community College (CCC). Students who complete an approved associate degree at CCC are guaranteed general admission into a corresponding baccalaureate degree program at Clarkson College.

By completing the Business Administration Associate of Applied Science (AAS) or Health Information Technology Associate of Applied Science (AAS) at CCC, **students transfer 60 semester hours as a direct transfer package** into the Bachelor of Science in Healthcare Management degree at Clarkson College. The following degree plan outlines the courses needed to complete this degree. The Bachelor of Science in Healthcare Management degree may be completed 100% online in as little as 4 semesters.
