Clarkson College has a signed articulation agreement with Iowa Western Community College (IWCC). Students who complete an approved associate degree at IWCC are guaranteed general admission into a corresponding baccalaureate degree program at Clarkson College.

By completing the Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN), A.A.S. degree at IWCC, students transfer 70 semester hours as a direct transfer package into the Bachelor of Science in Nursing - RN to BSN degree at Clarkson College. The following degree plan outlines the courses needed to complete this degree. The Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree may be completed in as little as three semesters and all courses are online. Students must have an active and unencumbered license prior to acceptance at Clarkson College.

Direct transfer package granted for completion of IWCC ADN degree: 70 semester hours.
