

3. Watch my daughters become mothers. I would love to experience being a mother to my daughters as they grow into mothers themselves. P. 3 **Spirit Week**

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

Allyson Doerr grew up in Pierce, Nebraska where her passion for healthcare began in high school after job shadowing a Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA). This experience solidified her career aspirations. She earned her BSN from Midland University in May 2011 and began working as a staff nurse in the Intensive Care Unit at Creighton University Medical Center later that year.

In 2013, Allyson was accepted into the Clarkson College nurse anesthesia program, a moment she describes as both thrilling and fortunate as it allowed her to remain in Omaha. During her clinical training, she worked with various CHI hospitals in the Omaha metro area with Immanuel Medical Center as her home base. She developed a strong connection with her mentors at Immanuel, ultimately joining their team as a CRNA after completing the program.

Allyson administered her first anesthetic as a student registered nurse anesthetist (SRNA) in 2015 and officially became a CRNA in 2017. In 2019, she took on the volunteer role of student clinical coordinator for SRNAs at CHI Immanuel and Mercy Council Bluffs. Over the years, she has streamlined processes and created handbooks to ease students into their clinical experiences.

Reflecting on her journey, Allyson credits Clarkson College with preparing her for a fulfilling career and making her high school dream a reality. Outside of her professional life, Allyson lives with her husband, Jacob Phillips, and their three huskies—Maximus, Archie, and Poppy. She volunteers with Taysia Blue Husky Rescue and enjoys gardening and houseplants, with a focus on preserving Nebraska native plants. Her home is certified as a Nebraska Pollinator Habitat, reflecting her passion for conservation and nature.

MELANIE ANN FINCH-MCCROY

Following graduation from Omaha's Central High School, Melanie attended Bishop College in Dallas, Texas, where she began her pre-nursing course work. She returned to Omaha and completed her education at Clarkson College, earning a Bachelor of Science in Nursing. Her career spans over 40 years and includes working in ICU/CCU and cardiac catheterization lab settings. She recently retired from Charles Drew Health Center, Inc. where she served as the Director of Nursing for 23 years. She found it fulfilling to have the privilege of serving the community in which she was raised. Melanie could be seen in the community performing blood pressure screenings at health fairs, walking or covering first aid stations at the Juneteenth, Native Omaha day and Benson parades, assisting with the administration of flu vaccines at Nelson Mandela School and as a participant in the Community Earn a Bike project.

Melanie is a lifelong member of Omaha's Zion Baptist Church and attributes her success as a nurse to her Christian upbringing. She serves as President of the Deaconess Ministry, Co-Chair of the Scholarship Ministry, member of the Usher's Nurses ministry, Women of Faith ministry, Culinary ministry, Health & Wellness ministry and she is an active participant in the Sunday School, Vacation Bible School & Discipleship Academy. A CAREER SHAPED BY CLARKSON COLLEGE: A REFLECTION BY TRISH WEBER

In this reflection, Trish Weber shares her thoughts on how Clarkson College affected her life and career.

"I feel like every step of my career here at Clarkson College, at just the right time, is an opportunity to fuel my passion, an opportunity to change healthcare.

My journey began as a student in the radiography and medical imaging programs, where I first discovered how innovation and technology can transform healthcare. Clarkson College taught me the value of patient-centered care and the importance of lifelong learning, principles that have shaped every step of my path.

One pivotal moment was the creation of the 3D Printing and Training Center. Seeing the growing need for skilled professionals in medical 3D printing, we launched the nation's first Medical 3D Printing Specialist certificate. This wasn't just about technology-it was about making medical 3D printing accessible to everyone. Our collaboration with industry leaders brought cutting-edge advancements right to the Clarkson College doorstep. In 2022, when the 3D Printing and Training Center opened its doors, it did so with a mission: to make 3D printing and visualization a universal language in personalized healthcare.

The center has since become a place of discovery and understanding, where clinicians and patients can better visualize diagnoses, and where research and simulation thrive. New doors kept opening, and in 2023, our partnership with 3D Systems allowed us to offer FDA 510(k) cleared, patient-specific devices to the healthcare community.

Every day, my heart swells with gratitude. I'm privileged to play a role in improving patient care and supporting clinicians. I think often of the legacy left by our founders, **Bishop and Meliora Clarkson**, who began this mission 137 years ago to serve the community and train compassionate healthcare professionals. I also draw inspiration from trailblazers like Dr. Patricia Book Perry, who broke boundaries in healthcare education.

I am lifted up daily by mentors at Clarkson College who have shown me unwavering support and belief. Their encouragement reminds me that innovation is a team effort, and our collective spirit fuels this journey.

I am grateful—for the past, for these opportunities, and for the chance to shape a future where technology, care, and community come together to make healthcare better for everyone."

Forged in History

NEW SCULPTURE HONORS MR. BRUCE LAURITZEN

THE FEBRUARY 2024 LOSS OF philanthropist and business leader, Bruce Lauritzen, impacted the Clarkson College community and the community at large. Throughout the region, Mr. Lauritzen, the great-great grandson of Bishop Robert and Meliora Clarkson and the chairman of First National Bank of Omaha, was known as a servant leader and supporter of healthcare. Clarkson College chose to commemorate Mr. Lauritzen's life of service by commissioning a new sculpture for the Clarkson Service League Heritage Garden.

The design incorporates the themes of knowledge and history. Local artist, **Jason Schleicher**, provided a sketch of a sundial positioned on an open book to renowned sculptor, **Les Bruning**. At his workshop in north downtown Omaha, Mr. Bruning forged the bronze sculpture.

The sculpture was dedicated to the memory of Bruce Lauritzen at the 18th annual Heritage Garden Walk held on September 26 during Clarkson College Spirit Week. The College was honored to have Mr. and Mrs. Clark Lauritzen and Bishop J. Scott Barker of the Episcopal Diocese of Nebraska in attendance.

The Not-sotypical Adventures of a '90s Nursing Student

Students heading off to college may hope to experience thrilling adventures. This was true for young **Dawn Brinkhoff** when she enrolled at Clarkson College in 1992. Her yearning for excitement, however, didn't necessarily involve an elevator at Kiewit Tower. But when she found herself alone and stuck, she mustered her strength to pry open the heavy metal doors and climb to the floor above to safety.

Such was the life for a co-ed away from home and living on-campus as a full-time nursing student. Dawn lived in Kiewit Tower for one year and then at a schoolowned apartment near 44th and Dodge Street. She was involved in campus activities, serving as a Resident Assistant for two years and as student government president for one year. She was also a student ambassador and enjoyed a work study job in the "skills lab." During her time at the College, Nursing was the majority program with classes held only in what is now referred to as the Main Building. General education coursework was completed at Bellevue University.

Two factors originally drew Dawn to Clarkson College. During high school, she was inspired by her

part-time job at a local nursing home. Participating in the "Clarkson Explorers" program sealed the deal. This group, comprised of area high school students, visited campus six times during the school year and explored healthcare careers during field trips to Clarkson Hospital (now Nebraska Medicine).

In the summer of 1995, between her junior and senior years at Clarkson College, Dawn set off on a real adventure. Alongside her roommate Melissa (Gray) Coen and six fellow students led by Dean Chuck Beauchamp, the group travelled to Chester, England to study for two months at Chester College (now known as University of Chester). They integrated with the English students, going to class and eating in the cafeteria. They were officially completing a Community Health nursing course and worked with a visiting health nurse traveling by train, bus, or foot for clinicals. They performed tasks such as mother/baby visits and childhood immunizations. The United Kingdom's National Health Service introduced a new way of doing things with emphasis on preventative health.

Fridays were free days, and their adventures took them to Scotland and Wales. Taking advantage of a few extra days granted for observance of Independence Day, the group took a boat overnight to Ireland, enjoying a boisterous on-board bunch of Elvis impersonators. They also had an opportunity to visit Melissa's Aunt Tilly, an English resident. At the end of their stay in England, they enjoyed exploring Rome and Paris during a 10-day tour.

With a memorable adventure or two under her belt, Dawn earned a BSN in 1996. She credits professors Dr. Mae Timmons and Dr. Fay Bower with inspiring her and many lifelong friendships forged for sustaining her.

While still an undergraduate, Dawn's nursing career began at Methodist Hospital in the postpartum department and as a CNA. After graduating, she accepted a full-time job at Children's Hospital in the pediatric intensive care unit then spent seven years in pediatric cardiology. During this time and with a growing family, Dawn transitioned into a role as a school nurse. She then earned a post-secondary teaching certificate through the University of Iowa and taught in the Missouri Valley (Iowa) school district as school nurse and health science teacher for 14 years. She also served on the Harrison County (IA) Board of Health, including a few years as Chair.

She earned a master's degree in nursing education from Nebraska Methodist, utilizing a nurse/faculty loan program where 80% of loans were forgiven if she worked as a nurse educator. Dawn returned to Clarkson College in 2017 as an instructor. With a continued desire to learn, she completed her Doctor of Education in Public Health Policy in 2023. She currently serves as an Associate Professor and Undergraduate Nursing Clinical Program Administrator for the Undergraduate Nursing Program at Clarkson College.

Dawn credits her career in nursing for many opportunities and flexibility to meet the needs of her growing family. She and her husband Daryl are the parents of three children, Riley, Alec, and Nikayla.

As Clarkson College continues to expand its program offerings, Dawn is proud to see that the reputation of the College continues. Graduates are highly regarded within the healthcare system. As the profession advances, Dawn believes the future of nursing will offer many opportunities and challenges. As nurses contribute significantly across various fields, she will continue striving to improve public health. She is committed to guiding her students in discovering their passion within their nursing careers.


