The **Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS)** is the core postsecondary education data collection program for the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), within the United States Department of Education. IPEDS collects data on postsecondary education in the United States in seven areas: institutional characteristics, institutional prices, enrollment, student financial aid, degrees and certificates conferred, student persistence and success, and institutional human and fiscal resources. This data is completed in the Fall term each academic year.
